## offices on the move

While continuing our broadcasts on the University of Indianapolis's WICR, the Fine Arts Society will move its offices and production facilities off campus for the first time since we began our association with UIndy in 1983. Our move from leased space on the UIndy campus is necessitated by UIndy's pressing space needs as it experiences significant enrollment increases.

As of late April, FAS offices and production studios will be in leased space at 1630 N. Meridian St., Indianapolis. Included in our lease will be use of existing production facilities in preparing our programs for broadcast on WICR. Our new landlord, WFYI, also boasts meeting and entertaining spaces of all sizes that will be available to us.

## program additions/updates

Just as they do at the start of each quarter, some of our syndicated broadcasts will change in April. New or returning from previous quarters will be *Indianapolis On The Air*, Sundays at 6 p.m. on FM and online (repeating online and on HD 2 Saturdays at 6 p.m.), *Raymond Leppard in Music*, Sundays at 7 p.m. (repeating Saturdays at 7 p.m.), *San Francisco Symphony*, Sundays at 10 p.m. (repeating Mondays at 1 p.m.), *Music Mountain Chamber Music*, Mondays at 11 p.m. (repeating Saturdays at 10 p.m.), *Santa Fe Chamber Music Festival*, Wednesdays at 11 p.m. (repeating Sundays at 8 a.m.), and the *Cleveland Orchestra*, Thursdays at 10 p.m. (repeating Saturdays at 8 p.m.).

Also, *Millennium of Music* moves from Sundays at 6 p.m. to Wednesdays at 10 p.m. (repeating Saturdays at 8 a.m.). *The UIndy Faculty Artist Series* and *Classics in Review* are going on hiatus and the *Christ Church Cathedral Choral Evensong* will air in April and May but then be off the air until September.

In their usual relaxed and engaging manner, Rich and Raymond will expand on the many anecdotes, stories and philosophies found in these two new volumes. Raymond will bring his books to life on the air and interweave the stories in them with his body of recording work as Music Director of the Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra.

## classical music with Peter Van De Graaff

Night owls and early risers are familiar with our overnight syndicated program, *Classical Music with Peter Van De Graaff*. All selections are programmed from the extensive WFMT (Chicago) record library of over 75,000 records and CD's. Van De Graaff draws music selections from all eras, but focuses on works from the Baroque, Classical and Romantic eras. While generally conservatively programmed to focus on the standards of the repertoire, he also doesn't hesitate to go beyond that and draw from the rich and varied music that comprises all of what we call "classical music." His programming philosophy is in line with that of our program director, Michael Toulouse, in that he also endeavors to share the music in an interesting manner.

We air *Classical Music with Peter Van De Graff* from midnight to 6 a.m. Monday through Friday on FM and online. It also airs online and on HD 2 Friday from 10 p.m. to Midnight and weekends from Midnight to 7 a.m.
